**Emergency Management – Brian Winslow**

Brian reported on the Public Officials Workshop that will be held on November 17<sup>th</sup> from 6 to 10 at the Penn Yan Fire Station.

Brian reported the State is now sending out notifications regarding NIMS compliance. Yates County is in compliance.

Brian reviewed several trainings that are taking place and/or will be taking place.

Brian reported he took part in the 9/11 ceremony and the annual pump testing is underway.

Brian reported he has been working on standardizing operating procedures countywide for emergency scenes and all departments have participated in this process.

Brian reviewed emergency responses attended.

### **Sheriff – Ron Spike**

Ron reviewed the following resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

- Recognition of Domestic Violence Awareness Month – October
- Promote Legislation for the use of video conferencing for inmate arraignments
- Promote Legislation to provide jail inmates Medicaid coverage 30 days before release for transition into the community
- Calling on the Gov. and Legislature to support NG911 technology and create department to support counties in dispatch PSAP service delivery, etc.
- Amend Res. 20-16 (FLH and inmate care)
- Court Security agreement (UCS-YC) \$377,867 - 2016-17
- Amend Res. 185-16 (Firearms range cost from per day to annual)

Ron reviewed the vacancy review form to fill a correction officer position. The Committee approved.

- Authorize Sheriff to fill vacant Correction Officer position

Ron reviewed the monthly statistics highlights follows:

Ron reported the Jail Population report, Yates County: 36, Federal: 7 for a Total = 43

There was also an inmate in Geneva General Hospital for 3 days which required overtime.

Ron reviewed the Revenue/Board Cost & Overtime which showed revenue collected \$157,778.64 so far. Overtime for correction officers has gone down a little with the addition of the two correction officers. Ron is also looking at some schedule changes.

Ron reported personnel will be submitting a resolution to increase the hourly rate for a part time cook as was discussed last month.

Ron reported the Jail Admin conference took place and the SCOC was there. Topics that were discussed, the living and breathing of inmates criteria was changed a little to where the inmate does not need to be woken but the correction officer needs to look for signs of distress, signs of vomiting and so on. Grievances were also discussed in changing the process so it is not so formal. HEP C was discussed with regards to inmates and their care. Not a lot of discussion on PREA which we are not in compliance with and can't be with this facility. The SCOC did agree that if we have a 16 or 17 year old individual committed to jail for more than a 90 day period, we now have an opportunity to deliver them to the Hudson Correctional Facility an DOC's will take care of them for anytime over 90 days. They did agree to Phase 1 and Phase 2 training so that a correction office could pick up through college some of the training hours.

Elden questioned if the Committee or the Legislature as a whole would be interested in engaging the SCOC. Elden's concern is that they have no concern of cost. Elden recommended passing a resolution or consider passing a resolution expressing our concern in Yates County. Try to get by in from the other counties and then send it up to NYSAC and the Executive Branch of the State Government. Elden was asked to put something together for a resolution and share it with the Sheriff to be brought forward.

Ron reported on the SWEAP program. For August there were 6 participants logging 125 hours of work. SWEAP did most hours at the Yates Co/Penn Yan airport 55 hours clearing brush and weeding. Next was Town of Middlesex with 34 hrs. for trash days and cleaning. At the Dundee Youth Center SWEAP cleaned as well doing 17 hrs. Additionally SWEAP walked county highways for 10 hours of Highway clean-up. One individual did not work due to medical issue, one individual appeared at the jail at 8AM positive for consuming of alcohol the Judge was notified of violation.

Ron reported a retired nurse will be shadowing and observing the Jail Nurse for possible temporary acceptance.

Ron reviewed various activities that are provided for the inmates.

Ron reported on the status of new deputies. A Deputy just finished field training. A Deputy graduates from Broome LE Academy on 10/21. Another Deputy is at the Elmira Academy. Handgun transition training is taking place and there are members attending several in-service training schools.

Ron reported E911 Dispatch achieved reaccreditation after two days of inspection.

Ron reported on September 8<sup>th</sup> there was a meeting of the Advisory Board. The IT Director has now been invited to the Advisory Board meetings because so much of what is talked about when it comes to technology and communications, IT is involved.

Ron reported he received a notice of awarded for the Sustainability Grant in the amount of \$175,108 from Homeland Security and Emergency Services for 2016-17. Ron is waiting for more details before he does a resolution.

Ron reported he has been working with STN and ECC to established terms for the PSAP fiber splice/connection.

Ron reported Emergency Services Dispatcher Murphy gave instruction on delivering a baby over the phone, and was given a commendation.

Ron reported the gateway is order that will connect the agency with the digital Steuben System. The gateway for Ontario County is on hold for the time being until a meeting can be set up.

Ron reported the Victim Impact Panel that was held on September 15<sup>th</sup> was successful with 36 participants and a new first time speaker was used. The speaker also spoke at PYA to students and is be schedule for Dundee in spring.

Ron clarified the need for critical debriefing of individuals and various contracts that are in place for emergency personnel if counseling should be needed after responding to a critical emergency scene.

Ron asked if anyone had and further questions of him for open or executive session. No one had questions.

Meeting adjourned at 5:10pm
