“New Cases” are the total number of new files opened each month. “New Felony” is the number of new cases where the top charge alleged is a felony (may or may not be maintained at that level after review). “New VOP” is number of Violations of Probation or Violations of Conditional Discharges filed. “Cases Closed” is the number of case files that were closed as completed with final disposition. New Cases less the New Felony & New VOP = All other cases (misdemeanors, violations, vehicle and traffic, etc.) Not shown are many prior years case appeals and post judgment application for relief which consume a substantial amount of staff time.

**Emergency Management – Brian Winslow**

Brian reported next month he will be presenting the updated New York State Fire Mutual Aid Plan resolution and the updated County Advisory Board.

Brian reported the Firefighter 1 class that was held in Penn Yan has completed.

Brian reported he attended the Regional Fire Administrator conference at the New York State Fire Academy.

Brian reviewed the emergency responses that he attended.

Brian reported Chris has been busy planning next year’s Farm Safety Days.

**Sheriff – Ron Spike**

The Sheriff could not attend the meeting, Undersheriff Gleason reported in his absence.

Jack reviewed the resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

Jack reported the Jail Population: Yates County – 37, Federal – 6, for a total of 43. The age range is 17 to 53.

Jack reported there are 4 participants for the SWEAP program. A total of 316 man hours were spent a 14 worksites.

Jack reviewed the revenue and overtime report. Revenue received so far this year is \$186,604.41 and \$300,000 was budgeted. There were 17,493 overtime hours logged.

Jack reported one of the part-time correction officers started yesterday and two more have had contingent offers made. Jack explained that one of the full time correction officer positions has been filled by taking a part-time correction officer to full time. The second position will be filled by a lateral transfer from another county and a contingent offer has been made.

Jack reported there is one inmate that has been boarded in Monroe County and is in the hospital. Monroe County has been guarding the individual and Jack expects the inmate to be back in Yates County tomorrow.

Jack reported the provisional Sergeant appointment for court security has now been made permanent.

Jack reported the department loaned their UTV to the Highway Department for use in constructing snow fence.

Jack reviewed the General Statistics for October-2015 the following are highlights:

 Total calls for service for Law Enforcement, EMS, Fire Departments, thru E911 were 1,752

Jack reported the Dundee tower requires a new highway dept. antenna which is an unplanned expense of \$2,650. This covers the climb, uninstal and new instal with calibration, etc. Funding for this is under discussion.

Dan moved to enter into executive session to discuss the proposed acquisition and lease of real property, contractual matters concerning a particular person or corporation, with the County Attorney, Undersheriff, legislators and newly elected legislators, Seconded by Bonnie.
