Sharon reported she has been dealing with a juvenile in security detention since April. Sharon explained this individual has had to be moved a couple of times and is being transferred to Erie County hopefully until the end of June and then will not be in a secured facility.

Emergency Management – Brian Winslow

Brian reported the Red Cross has asked to have an MOU with them stating that the County will include them during times of Emergency. The County Attorney has approved the MOU and Brian will have a resolution authorizing him to sign it for Monday's meeting.

Brian reported the 4 County Haz Mat team has met several times regarding accreditation.

Brain reported there have been quite a few training classes held. This is the time of the year where training slows down.

Brian reported he has been working with the County Fire Advisory Board doing a county wide accountability program. All fire departments are willing to try this Brian continues to work on putting something together.

Brian reported he has been appointed as the Vice President of the Lake District Emergency Manager.

Brian reported he has been asked by the Fire Coordinators of NYS to sit on the Board of Directors. The Committee has no issues with this.

Brian reported Chris has been working on farm planning training, grain bin rescue training and she just finished car seat recertification.

Sheriff – Ron Spike

Ron reviewed the following resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

- Authorize Sheriff to renew jail drug services agreement 2016
- Authorize Sheriff to renew Nixle services agreement 2015-16

Ron reported the Jail Population: Yates County: 40, Federal: 7 for a total of 47 of which there are 40 males and 7 females.

Ron reviewed the revenue report which showed \$71,233.58 has been received so far through April and \$300,000 was budgeted.

Ron reported the overtime hours. Approximately 300 hours was logged due to 3 inmates being hospitalized and having to be guarded along with medical transports. The new Correction Officer's that were hired have not had an impact on the overtime as yet because of the hiring of them. One Correction Officer that was able to be hired right away was offset by the other Correction Officer who is a deputy sheriff who then went to basic school in February. There was no net gain which put the Sheriff back to being two down. As Ron reported last month he went through the process of trying to do lateral transfers on some Correction Officer's from other agencies and neither one of those passed the background investigation so then the Sheriff had to switch over to hire from the list. Last week the Sheriff hired one individual to fill one of those positions who is still in on the job training. Ron was able to hire an individual yesterday from Seneca County who was on the list but that individual will not be able to start until June 22nd. Ron expects to see some impact on overtime in July. Ron explained that 30 hours in overtime was saved by changing some of the scheduling but with a lot going on it's not readily noticed.

Ron reported there are 11 individuals in the SWEAP program.

Ron reported there was an issue with the Velocity software program which stopped but was able to be rebooted. Ron commented that he is being told there will be a day when the program will not come back up and it needs to be upgraded.

Ron reported the Tip411 program is working well. He is currently having posters printed which will be placed in various places around the county.

Ron reported the Memorial for fallen officers at the Public Safety Building was successful and well attended.

Ron reported the K9 annual training event and demo was held and went well with 40 officers in attendance.

Ron reported he attended Congressman Reed's Opioid forum, along with Deb Minor.

Ron reported Tim Groth and he attended the STN Managed IT Services Meeting. Steve Manning would like to have a follow-up meeting something this month.

Ron reported the 3rd handgun safety training was held for 50 individuals. The feedback has been good and Ron has no plans for further training this year at this time. Over 200 people attended the 3 trainings.
