Minutes of the June meeting were approved as presented.

SOCIAL SERVICES: Amy Miller

Amy reviewed the following resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

- Amend Resolution 407-15, Enter Into Contract With Keuka Housing Council
- Amend Resolution 242-16 Youth Bureau Contracts
- Authorize Chairman To Sign Resource Allocation Plan
- Authorize Chairman To Sign Lifeguard MOU's
- Authorize Amended Foster Care Rates Effective April 1, 2016
- Authorize Contract With Safe Harbors of the Finger Lakes for Non-Residential Domestic Violence Programming

Amy reviewed a position review form for the Employment and Training Supervisor in Workforce Development and any subsequent positions that may become vacant if filled within. The Consensus of the Committee was to refill the position.

Amy updated the Committee on various funding issues. An administrative Directive was issued to raise the foster care rates by 2%. Also, the allocation for Title XX block grant has been received in the amount of \$57,013.

Amy updated the Committee on Workforce Development activities. Unemployment rates for Yates County in May were 3.9%, there were 15 job placements in June. Also there were 15 clients in Community Service/Work Experiences in the County. There were 29 workshops held in June, two of which were job fairs for employers.

Amy updated the Committee on Youth Bureau activities. Budget allocations have been received in the amount of \$28,817 which added an additional \$1,105 to the original allocation. Also, the Distinguished Youth Award will be done at the August Legislative meeting.

PUBLIC HEALTH: Deb Minor

Deb reported on the status of various programs. Consolidated Review of all Public Health Programs took place the week of June 6th. Also, Ontario County Public Health submitted the Multi-Jurisdictional application for accreditation on June 21st.

Deb explained over the next 3 months members of the Choose Health Yates Coalition will work to develop the 2017 -2019 Community Health Improvement plan outlining strategies and responsible agencies to address issues pertaining to health priorities.

Deb reported staff have been busy doing various presentations for Bed Bugs, Ticks/Lyme Disease, and Zika Virus. Training was also done for Grain Bine Rescue and Yates Farm Safety Training event will be held August 20th at the Benton Fire House.

Deb reported the Yates Substance Abuse Coalition adopted a set of By-Laws and elected a Steering Committee and a slate of officers at their May meeting.

Deb reviewed the following resolution that would be needed. The Committee approved.

OFFICE FOR THE AGING: Katie Smeenk

Katie could not attend the meeting but submitted a written report on various updates for staffing, fiscal, nutrition services and grant submissions.

COMMUNITY SERVICES: George Roets

George reviewed the following resolution that would be needed. The Committee approved.

George updated the Committee on various programs, the SAFE Act had 7 reports one was sent to the state. Along with fiscal funding that has been received and a review of the Finger Lakes Regional Planning Consortium.

VETERANS: Philip Rouin

Phil reviewed the monthly statistics for the office as far as contacts, services and transportations done.

Phil reviewed upcoming Veteran related community events and meetings along with the claims that were settled last month.

Discussion took place on cameras for the Public Defender's office, the consensus of the Committee was to move forward. Further discussion will take place at the Public Works Committee.
