Ron reported on the Jail Population. Yates County: 37, Federal -6 for a total of 43. The highest population committed any one day was 54 and there is 1 boarded out of county.

Ron reviewed the Revenue & Overtime Report, which shows a total of \$174,249.58 has been received through July.

Ron reported the SCOC will do their annual cycle inspection in October.

Ron reported there were 73 prisoner transports in July.

The SWEAP program had 10 participants for the month of July for a total of 338 man-hours at 14 worksites.

Ron reported there have been no applicants for the part-time jail cook position. Discussion took place on increasing the salary for part-time help. Ron will work with Personnel.

Ron reported he met with the Keuka Park Association, Keuka College and Town of Jerusalem representatives regrading noise issues.

Ron reviewed the status of recent deputy hires that have been in school.

Ron reported he submitted a sustainability grant in the amount of \$170,000. He is waiting to hear if the grant has been approved.

Ron reported he has requested gateways for Steuben and Ontario Co operability and attended the STN PSC board meeting on August 23rd. A lengthy discussion took place on running fiber to some of the tower sites.

Ron reported the next Victim Impact Panel will be held on September 15, 2016. There will be a new speaker this year, and arrangements have been made for the speaker to also speak at the Penn Yan Academy and Dundee School.

Ron will be attending the NYSAC conference September 19 thru 21st in Niagara Falls.
